From the Desk of Father Tim . . .

Merry Christmas



I consider myself to be very blessed to welcome you to St. Rita Church for Christmas. Whether a parishioner or a guest, I am so glad that you are here.

I have a spiritual suggestion for all of you: whatever Mass you are attending, spend some of your Christmas time reading, praying, and pondering the Gospel that is used at the Mass on Christmas Morning. It is John 1:1-18.

I think you will find it to be moving, inspiring, provocative, powerful, and a fresh take on the meaning of Christmas. It begins with the words,

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

What does it mean that it begins with the same three words as the Book of Genesis? A little bit later in the reading we have perhaps the most important words in all the scriptures, because it has formed so much of what we believe about Jesus,

"And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth."

This is the very core of the meaning of Christmas for us who believe. The Word can bring a calming and healing light into the darkest of our times and be the grace that we need to move forward in hope.

There is so much to discover in this reading. If after pondering it on your own you want to have more to think about, you can use a google search like "catholic+commentary+John 1:1-18" and see what you might be able to discover.

I pray for you and yours to have all the blessings of a most Joyful Christmas!

Reflections on Readings for the Fourth Sunday of Advent

"He Shall Be Peace!"



In this fourth Sunday of Advent, the Church shifts our focus from the prophecies of the end times to the coming birth of our savior, Jesus.

In our first reading ([Micah 5:1-4](#)), the prophet Micah proclaimed the role of Bethlehem, the ancient birthplace of King David, as the birthplace of the savior Messiah, who would restore the children of Israel from the scattered lands. The Prophet Micah writes, *"You, Bethlehem-Ephrathah too small to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel ... He shall stand firm and shepherd his flock by the strength of the LORD, in the majestic name of the LORD, his God..."*

In our Epistle reading ([Hebrews 10:5-10](#)), we hear of Jesus's suffering for the sins of the world, in contrast to the repeated and imperfect sacrifice of the priests under the old law. Jesus understood that the continual offering of blood sacrifices did not effect the forgiveness of their sins, so he, perceiving the will of the Father, offered his own body for the forgiveness of sins once, for all. The Hebrews author writes, *"When Christ came into the world, he said: 'Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me; in holocausts and sin offerings you took no delight. Then I said, 'As is written of me in the scroll, behold, I come to do your will, O God.'"*

In our Gospel reading ([Luke 1:39-45](#)), we hear of Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, who was pregnant with John the Baptist. Elizabeth proclaimed the child in Mary's womb as "my Lord" as Elizabeth's own child in her womb "leaped for joy" at the sound of Mary's voice. *"When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?'"*

And so we take heart - it won't be long now. Our Christ is near, and when He comes, He Shall Be Peace! May we take that peace into our hearts and may it rule our lives.

Are you looking for your child(ren) to prepare for their First Communion or their Confirmation in the coming year? Congratulations! I'm looking forward to supporting you along your family's sacramental journey!

- If you have a child who will be entering 1st grade next school year, Faith Formation next fall will lay the foundation for their First Reconciliation and First Communion in 2nd grade. Catholic schools are also a fantastic foundation in our faith. If you have a child in 1st grade now, but they're not in Faith Formation or Catholic school this year, please reach out to me about Faith Formation so that we can get you ready for next year.
- If you have a child who will be entering 8th grade next school year, Confirmation awaits! This two-year preparation program begins in September and is open to youth in 8th grade and above.

Look for enrollment to open on our website this summer.

Enrollment is due in early September, and we get started a few weeks after the new school year begins. I'm excited to work with you. In the meantime, I look forward to seeing you at Mass! 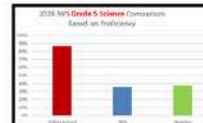
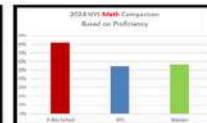
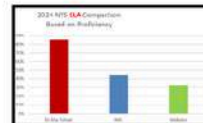
